You must have completed the New Zealand Certificate in Hairdressing (Salon Support) (Level 3), or an equivalent qualification, before progressing into this qualification.

During this programme, you will gain the up-to-date skills that are in demand in the commercial salon environment and build your portfolio throughout the year.

You will study in our on-site hair salon and work with real clients to advance your cutting, consultation, colouring and styling techniques. This programme also includes a compulsory 90 hour work placement. You will graduate with the ability to enter directly into the third year of your apprenticeship in industry.

Please note: Due to programme reviews, this qualification will be offered for the last time in 2020. It will no longer be offered after this date.

Entry requirements

- > We prefer that you have completed our New Zealand Certificate in Hairdressing (Salon Support) (Level 3) or an equivalent qualification.
- > Applications from mature students (over 20) are welcome.
- > International students will be individually assessed to ensure you are ready for this study.
- > If English is not your first language, you must provide:
 - > New Zealand University Entrance OR
 - > Overall Academic IELTS 5.5 with no individual band score lower than 5.5 (achieved in one test completed in the last two years), OR
 - > Acceptable alternative evidence of the required IELTS (see here for NZQA proficiency table)

- > Course workload for this programme will require approximately 20 hours, per week, of directed study in the form of salon and classroom sessions.

- > In order for you to successfully complete the programme, it is expected that you will also spend approximately 15 hours per week of your own time in self-directed learning, and a minimum of 90 hours of work experience within the year.
