You'll take part in practical workshops at Otago Polytechnic, undertake 150 hours of authentic work experience, volunteer in the community, explore your own study style and potential work options, learn about Health and Safety and build your employability skills (reading, writing, numeracy, digital literacy and the use of Te Reo).

With small class sizes and very supportive staff, take advantage of the chance to upskill in a way that suits you.

And, if you're keen to keep learning once you finish this programme, we provide plenty of options for further study in trades, farming, conservation and outdoor, practical work.

Entry requirements

> Applicants will need to have a meeting with a Malcam Charitable Trust staff member to ensure the programme will meet your needs.

What will I study?

This programme is a great mix of study and hands-on experience. You'll take part in practical workshops, volunteer in the community, undertake 150 hours of work experience, explore your own study style and potential careers, learn about Health and Safety and build your employability skills (reading, writing, numeracy, digital literacy, use of Te Reo).

Get further training in farming, agriculture, horticulture or conservation with Otago Polytechnic's New Zealand Certificate in Foundation Skills (Level 2) or New Zealand Certificate in Study and Career Preparation (Level 3).

Student loans and allowances

Domestic students (only) will be eligible to go onto the Job Seeker benefit through Work and Income NZ. You will need to apply for this on an individual basis.
