Want to discover more about the Treaty of Waitangi in regard to its historical and modern relevance to our society? Keen to learn how to apply the Treaty articles to your own professional practice?

This two day workshop provides an environment in which you can explore the Treaty of Waitangi/Te Tiriti o Waitangi and its implications in a non-confrontational, collaborative process. This learning framework enables you to understand the historical context of Te Tiriti as well as the contemporary debate and its relevance. The workshop will examine a broad range of issues, including those which you may raise.

Upon completion of this short course, you will be able to discuss the social conditions of each of the signatories and recognise the shifts in power between the signatories after the signing of Te Tiriti. You will also be able to debate the history and current status of Kai Tahu and the relationship of organisations to Mana Whenua and apply the articles of Te Tiriti to your own occupational/professional practice.
