Successful graduates will receive the New Zealand Certificate in Horticulture (**Level 3**) (Nursery Production).

Entry requirements

- > Open entry.

This programme is not available to international students.

> If English is not your first language, you must provide:

- > New Zealand University Entrance OR
- > Overall Academic IELTS 5.5 with no individual band score lower than 5.0 (achieved in one test completed in the last two years), OR
- > Acceptable alternative evidence of the required IELTS (see here for NZQA proficiency table and here for list of recognised proficiency tests).

## You will study

This programme is based in your workplace with regular visits from your programme facilitator. You will also have the opportunity to attend some block courses at the Central Campus. You will build your experience and knowledge of the techniques required to propagate and grow commercial nursery crops, as well as identifying, naming and selecting plants for a range of sites. The courses in this programme include:

- > Communication (10 credits)
- > Nursery Plant Care (15 credits)
- > Plant Identification and Selection (15 credits)
- > Propagation (15 credits)
- > Plant Science (15 credits).

## Your workload

You should expect to spend a minimum of 10 hours a week on this programme.

## Student loans with TTAF
